
Bikes, burgers & beverages

Puerto Rico Hurricane Recovery mission trip

On Sept. 20, 2017, Hurricane Maria slammed into the island of Puerto Rico as a Category 5 storm. In the weeks and months following the storm, Puerto Rico experienced shortages of water and food. There was no electricity, no phone lines, no cell phone or internet capabilities. Emergency response services were crippled, and the medical system collapsed.

The United Methodist Church and United Methodist Committee on Relief partnered with the Methodist Church of Puerto Rico to create the Rehace (pronounced Re-ah-se) initiative. In post-Maria Puerto Rico, Rehace is tasked with reconstructing homes; even more importantly, it helps families get through the psychological effects of surviving a devastating natural disaster.

Christine Stepan has been in contact with the Rehace leader for Puerto Rico, and dates for a team have been confirmed for **Saturday**, **Feb. 1**, **to Saturday**, **Feb. 8**, **2020**.
