Do you have an IRA? IRS rules mandate that people age 70½ and older take Required Minimum Distributions from their IRA each year, regardless of whether they need the income. These annual withdrawals are subject to ordinary income taxes. By making a contribution from your IRA WBLUMC, you can satisfy your RMD amount without reporting additional income. **How it works:** The provision allows retirees age 70½ and older to donate up to \$100,000 tax free from their IRA each year. Generally, when you take a distribution from your IRA, it is treated as taxable income. Under this provision, made permanent in the 2015 federal spending and tax package, those assets are excluded from income if the distribution is made directly to a charity. Talk to your financial adviser. It's important to consider your tax situation before deciding whether to make a charitable contribution from

your IRA.
